Jose L. Leos began his service to both his country and community by enlisting in the United States Navy. After completing his naval service, Jose became a Police Officer with the Village of Berkeley, Illinois Police Department where he served for 5 years. In 2006, Jose joined the Village of Skokie, Illinois Police Department. Officer Jose Leos served the community with distinction for 14 years not only as a Patrol Officer but also as an Evidence Technician and Crisis Negotiator for the Department's Tactical Intervention Unit (TIU). Upon being diagnosed with advanced stage lung cancer despite being a non-smoker, Officer Leos' main concern was for his family. Officer Leos is survived by his wife and two children.
